Role Purpose

The Director of Programming leads the strategic vision, planning, and execution of AIGA Dallas programming. This role ensures that chapter events are intentional, inclusive, and aligned with member needs, national initiatives, and the organization's long-term goals—while creating meaningful experiences that bring the design community together.

This is a high-impact leadership role that connects strategy to execution and supports Program Chairs in delivering successful, engaging events.

Mission

To facilitate the development of high-quality programs that fulfill AIGA Dallas's mission by bringing people together in inclusive spaces for experiences that inspire, educate, and serve the local design and creative community.

Core Responsibilities

- Envision, draft, and maintain an annual programming calendar informed by:
 - Member feedback and surveys
 - Event sales and attendance reports
 - AIGA National initiatives
 - Board and committee goals
- Establish and maintain clearly defined objectives for each program to ensure purpose, relevance, and impact
- Develop and maintain a comprehensive Program Chair Toolkit, including:
 - Event planning timelines
 - Clear checklists for execution
 - Best practices and past learnings
- Support Program Chairs by:
 - Monitoring progress and timelines
 - Ensuring timely delivery of artwork and copy
 - Providing guidance and problem-solving support as needed



- Monitor live event sales and collaborate with the Communications Team to maximize attendance and engagement
 - Maintain program and post-event reports, documenting:
 - Wins and challenges
 - Data and analytics
 - Attendance and feedback
 - Actionable insights for future improvement
 - Establish and maintain a curated list of:
 - Potential panelists
 - Speakers
 - Design topics and emerging trends
 - Ensure all guests, speakers, and partners:
 - Are well-informed and supported before events
 - Receive cross-promotion links when appropriate
 - Are formally and graciously thanked within 24 hours of event conclusion
 - Act as a strategic connector between:
 - Program Chairs
 - Communications
 - Partnerships
 - Onsite Experience teams
 - Attend at least half of AIGA Dallas events and one board meeting per month
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Engagement Expectations

This role requires consistent involvement, leadership presence, and follow-through. The Director of Programming is expected to:

- Proactively guide the direction and quality of chapter programming
- Support and hold Program Chairs accountable to timelines and objectives
- Continuously assess what is working—and what can be improved
- Ensure programs evolve with the needs of the community

Success is measured not by the number of events, but by their quality, relevance, attendance, and impact.
