Role Overview

The AIGA Dallas Event Photographer is responsible for visually documenting chapter programs and events to support marketing, storytelling, and promotion of the organization. This role plays a critical part in capturing the energy, diversity, and community of AIGA Dallas through high-quality photography used across social media, the website, newsletters, and promotional materials.

Responsibilities

- Attend AIGA Dallas events and photograph all key phases of each event, from arrival and networking to panels, speakers, and closing moments
- Capture dynamic group interactions, candid moments, speaker and panelist engagement, mentor conversations, partner participation, and audience reactions
- Include strategic shots from behind the audience looking toward the stage or speakers, while avoiding images with large areas of empty chairs or tables
- Focus on angles and compositions that convey a full, active, and engaged room
- Curate and edit the strongest 20–40 images per event, ensuring proper exposure, color balance, and clean framing (cropping out distractions such as trash cans, cluttered tables, or unused space)
- Upload the final selection of images to a cloud folder or other digital method within 48 hours of the event for download and immediate use by the social media and communications teams
- Communicate availability, confirmations, or conflicts as early as possible to ensure coverage planning

Skills & Traits

- Advanced knowledge of photography principles, composition, lighting, and visual storytelling
- Strong attention to detail and consistency in image quality
- Willingness to move throughout the space and actively seek out meaningful interactions and moments
- Understanding of art direction and how photography supports marketing, branding, and promotion
- Reliable, organized, and able to meet fast turnaround deadlines

Note:

To balance the increased time commitment required for event attendance, this role does **not** require board meeting attendance or formal program chair responsibilities.
